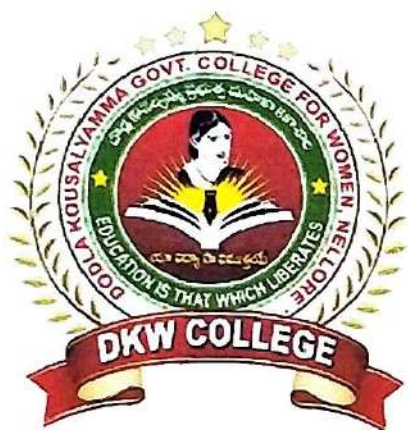

ACADEMIC COUNCIL: As per the UGC guidelines dated 19-01-2018

COMPOSITION OF ACADEMIC COUNCIL:

1. The Principal (Chairman)
2. All the Heads of Departments in the college
3. Four teachers of the college representing different categories of teaching staff by rotation on the basis of seniority of service in the college.
4. Not less than four experts/academicians from outside the college representing such areas as Industry, Commerce, Law, Education, Medicine, Sciences etc., to be nominated by the Governing Body.
5. Three nominees of the university not less than Professors.
6. A faculty member nominated by the Principal (Member Secretary).

Functions of the Academic Council:

The Academic Council shall have powers to:

- (a) Scrutinize and approve the proposals with or without modification of the boards of studies with regard to courses of study, academic regulations, curricular, syllabi and modifications thereof, instructional and evaluation arrangements, methods, procedures relevant there etc., provided that where the Academic Council differs on any proposal, it shall have the right to return the matter for reconsideration to the board of studies concerned or reject it, after giving reasons to do so.
- (b) Make regulations regarding the admission of students to different programmes of study in the college keeping in view the policy of the Government.
- (c) Make regulations for sports, extra-curricular activities, and proper maintenance and functioning of the playgrounds and hostels.
- (d) Recommend to the Governing Body proposals for institution of new programs of study.
- (e) Recommend to the Governing Body institution of scholarships, studentships, fellowships, prizes and medals, and to frame regulations for the award of the same. Advise the Governing Body on suggestions(s) pertaining to academic affair made by it.
- (f) Perform such other functions as may be assigned by the Governing Body.

Agenda Item No. 2: Adapting New Education Policy (NEP) as per the norms laid down by the Govt. of India

NEP 2020 is the first education policy of the 21st century and replaces the thirty-four year old National Policy on Education (NPE), 1986. Built on the foundational pillars of Access, Equity, Quality, Affordability and Accountability, this policy is aligned to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and aims to transform India into a vibrant knowledge society and global knowledge superpower by making both school and college education more holistic, flexible, multidisciplinary, suited to 21st century needs and aimed at bringing out the unique capabilities of each student.

The aim will be to:

- Increase GER in higher education to reach at least 50% by 2035.
- Holistic Multidisciplinary Education
- undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications- a certificate after completing 1 year in a discipline or field including vocational and professional areas, or a diploma after 2 years of study, or a Bachelor's degree after a 3-year programme.

Agenda Item No.3: Implementation of Autonomous status to the Existing UG programmes

The U.G.C. declared Autonomous status to the college from the Academic year 2016. So the college has constituted various Academic and Administrative bodies such as Governing Body, Academic Council, Finance Committee, Controller of Examinations that are needed for the smooth functioning of Autonomy. As per the guidelines of the U.G.C.

the college seeks the approval of the Academic Council for the implementation of Autonomy in all the existing UG programmes for the seventh Academic year 2022-23.

A proposal for the extension of autonomy from the academic year 2022-23 onwards for a period of 10 years has been submitted to Autonomy Extension Cell, UGC, New Delhi.

APSCHE has revised the CBCS frame work from the year 2020-21 by introducing the following new aspects

- Life Skill Courses and Skill development courses are offered in 1st, 2nd and 3rd semesters.
- Skill Enhancement Courses are introduced in the final year syllabus
- All the UG programmes shall be 3/4year programmes.
- There will be exit points at the end of third year and fourth year as per the willingness of the students.
- Students will have to undergo 2 months internship at the end of the second semester and fourth semester.
- 6 months Internship/Apprenticeship (12 credits) is mandatory for the students for the completion of Course.

Agenda Item No 10: Rules on Attendance requirements

Regular attendance to classes improves the learning achievement among students and instills a sense of discipline as well. However as there will be students with genuine health and other such problematic issues, a set of rules is proposed with reference to student attendance. Minimum attendance for a semester is placed at 75% which will be 67 days of the total number of 90 teaching days per semester. Students with attendance percentage between 50 to 75% are allowed to attend Semester End examinations by paying the Condonation Fee.

The Examination Cell which is constituted following the revised Guidelines of the U.G.C., with one Controller of Examinations and one Assistant Controllers of Examinations, proposes to conduct examinations for the students of all the three years.

Grafting is a procedure in which the individual who has got less marks than aggregate in one paper will be adjusted with a maximum of three marks from the high scored paper of that student. (Ex: for an MPC candidate, if she has failed with two marks in mathematics she will be benefited from the other subjects where she scored higher marks). Grafting allows transfer of marks from donor paper/s to make up the deficiency of marks in the failed paper/s. The first potential donor paper is that in which highest marks have been obtained. If other donor papers are required, those will be considered on the basis

of descending order of marks. It is to be noted that grafting will not change the aggregate marks obtained by the student. After the grafting, the failed paper will be marked as passed.

- a. The maximum number of marks that can be transferred from any donor paper is **three** marks only.
- b. Grafting procedure is limited to **two papers**.
- c. The transfer of the marks will be allowed **from theory to theory or practical to practical papers**.
- d. Grafting is allowed **within the parts** only:
 - i. Part-A - Languages.
 - ii. Part-B - Foundation Courses.
 - iii. Part-C -Subjects.

- (c) 3rd and final Internship/apprenticeship on Job training in 5th and 6th semesters (6 months) (12 credits)

Resolutions Item No.9: Resolved to Approve the additional credits for Co-curricular and extracurricular activities

- To award **1 credit per academic year** for attending all the three National Festivals like Independence day, Gandhi Jayanti and Republic day, after duly attending weekly college assembly with more than 75% attendance.
- To award **1 credit** for Offline certificate courses conducted by the departments/ Online certificate courses like Swayam, MOOCs, NPTEL, IIT Spoken Tutorials etc.
- To award **1 credit** on submission of a certificate recording 100 hours of service in any **ONE** of the following activities NCC/ NSS/ YRC/ RRC
- To award **1 credit** for state level achievement in literary and cultural activities, **2 credits** for National Level Achievements.
- To award **1 credit** for winners at inter university and state level participation in Sports and Games, **2 credits** for winners at National level Sports and Games.

Credits are awarded at the time of completion of the Programme.

Resolutions Item No 10: Resolved to approve the Rules on Attendance requirements

Regular attendance to classes improves the learning achievement among students and instills a sense of discipline as well. However as there will be students with genuine health and other such problematic issues, a set of rules are proposed with reference to student attendance. Minimum attendance for a semester is placed at 75%, which will be 67 days of the total number of 90 teaching days per semester. Students with attendance percentage between 50 to 75% are allowed to attend Semester End examinations by paying the Condonation Fee.

Resolutions Item No 11: Resolved to implement the Continuous Internal Assessment procedure given by the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Andhra Pradesh.

The Examination Cell which is constituted by following the revised Guidelines of the U.G.C., with one Controller of Examinations and one Assistant Controller of Examinations, proposes to conduct examinations for the students of all the three years.

- i) Resolved to Implement Continuous Internal Assessment procedure given by the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Andhra Pradesh. The allotment of External and Internal Assessment is proposed to be 70% and 30 % respectively. The internal assessment is as per CIA pattern i.e for 50 marks and then it scale down to 30 marks.
- ii) Resolved the allotment of External and Internal Assessment is proposed to be 70% External and 30% Internal
- iii) Resolved that the Examination notification period is proposed for 40 or 45 days before the commencement of external examination.
- iv) Resolved to follow the guidelines of CBCS, 40% is considered as minimum pass percentage in External evaluation and
- v). Resolved the Evaluation scheme for Practical is proposed to be; (i) Internal evaluation for 50 marks in odd Semester (ii) External evaluation for 50 marks in even Semester.
- vi. Resolved to conduct Special external examination for the students who have to miss their examinations in order to attend important NCC, NSS, Sports and Cultural events.

- vii. Resolved to conduct Instant examination to the backlogs in 5 and 6 semesters for final year regular students who cleared 1 to 4 semesters.
- viii. Resolved to allow a maximum of three attempts for the supplementary after completion of the Programme.
- ix. Resolved that the detained students will rejoin in the next year for the detained semester.
- x. Resolved to appoint senior most faculty as team of observers who are nominated by the committee constituted by the college in order to ensure fair conduct of examinations. The team plays the role of internal squad in the conduct of internal as well as external examinations. If any case of malpractice is identified, then the candidate is debarred from that paper and will be allowed to write other exams. The level of punishment will depend on the severity of malpractice which will be decided by the committee.
- xi. Resolved that the Students representing National Sports and Games and who are selected for training in specialized institutions are allowed to write the examinations after the submission of attendance certificate from the respective body.

Resolutions Item No.12: Resolved that for all LSCs and SDCs field work or Project is the mode of internal assessment w.e.f 2020-2021. There will be no any written examination in the Internal Examinations of LSCs and SDCs. Assessment will be done by way of project or fieldtrip.

The moderation by grafting is considered two papers in which the pass percentage is less than 40 with a maximum of three marks for both papers.

Grafting is a procedure in which the individual who has got less marks than aggregate in one paper will be adjusted with a maximum of three marks from the high scored paper of that student. (Ex: for an MPC candidate, if she has failed with two marks in mathematics she will be benefited from the other subjects where she scored higher marks). Grafting allows transfer of marks from donor paper/s to make up the deficiency of marks in the failed paper/s. The first potential donor paper is that in which highest marks have been obtained. If other donor papers are required, those will be considered on the basis of descending order of marks. It is to be noted that grafting will not change the aggregate marks obtained by the student. After the grafting, the failed paper will be marked as passed.

- a. The maximum number of marks that can be transferred from any donor paper is **three** marks only.
- b. Grafting procedure is limited to **two papers**.
- c. The transfer of the marks will be allowed **from theory to theory or practical to practical** papers.
- d. Grafting is allowed **within the parts** only:
 - i. Part-A - Languages.

ii. Part-B - Foundation Courses.

iii. Part-C -Subjects.
